Variables in Game

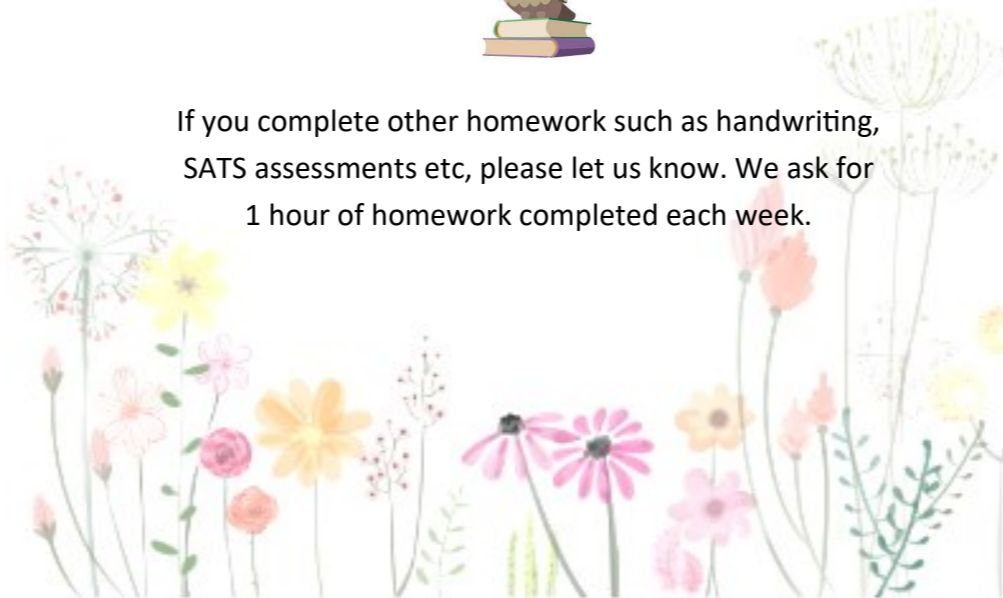

We practise these spellings, as well as common exception words, each day in class too!

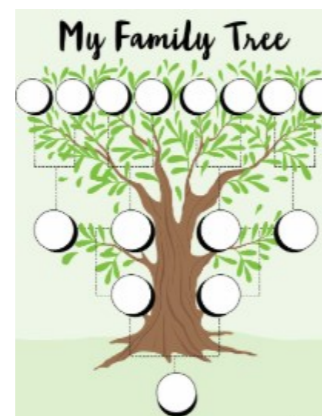

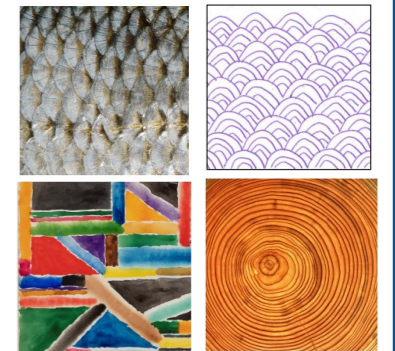
